I checked the ESA website and found out that "ESA's Care Connection was developed as a link to provide a network of services to ESA members, their families and communities. The program is administered by the Senior Past President of the ESA International Council." There is a form to fill out that "connects" you to the network.

council/care-connection. Each member who wishes to participate can fill out the form. You can check the boxes on the form that say you are willing to act as a contact person for an ESA member, family member, or friend relocating to your area, visiting and needs assistance, lives in area and needs assistance, have experience that could help someone who needs it, or if you need help. Wouldn't it be awesome if we all filled out the form?

Also, we cannot forget our Heroes. Coupons are still a viable option for helping pursuant to the ESA website.

#### MILITARY OVERSEAS COUPON PROGRAM

The process for finding the bases that participate in the Overseas Coupon Program has changed a little. Please go to the following military web site: http://www.ocpnet.org/

- 1. Go to the "Base List" tab. There you'll find a list of bases available to "adopt" and that are open to receive coupons
- 2. Click on the "Mailing" tab. There is also information near the bottom of the page on the best method for mailing the coupons.
- 3. Next go to the "Adoption" tab. Please read through the page on how to adopt a base. They request that you adopt a base because your adoption email is how they prove their charity to the U.S. Government. It is recommended that prior to sending coupons that you adopt a base.
- 4. Choose the "Adoption Form" tab and complete the form with your information.
- 5. Then mail you coupons to the base you chose to adopt.

If you do not want to adopt a base, you may mail the coupons to an "open" base by checking the list at the website above (choose from the "Base List" tab) each time you want to mail the coupons to see which base is open. The adoption process is for verifying the program and for trying to keep donations even to each base. You adopt the base and then they can count on your steady donations each month (or some regular schedule you establish).
